Pupils with SEND will: Be provided with teaching adapted to meet their needs. Be included in all aspects of school life. Be provided with quality first teaching, differentiated to their needs. Be respected and acknowledged - their contributions will be valued and celebrated. Pupils with SEND may: Have specific 1:1 or small group support to help them access different areas of the curriculum - i.e. to support their phonics, maths, literacy or speech and language learning. Take part in social and emotional support interventions such as self-regulation, emotional literacy. Have interventions outside of the classroom Take part in social, emotional and mental health interventions Be supported by external agencies such as Speech and Language Therapist, Occupational Therapist, Community Paediatric services or CAMHS, CYPS, Dyslexia NorthEast, educational psychologist - to develop specific targets/programmes tailored to the child's individual needs.
