

Learning Achievements

Reception: this week we have been looking at what food mini beasts like to eat and pretended to be 'The Bad Tempered Ladybird'. In Maths, we have been working on solving take away problems.

Class 1: this week we have been creating our own flowers and plants and describing them. We have also been learning to tell the time using an analogue clock.

Class 2: have been following and writing instructions on how to create a bug hotel. They had to improve the original instructions by making them child-friendly and easy to follow. An advert was then produced to encourage mini beasts to locate to these new premises in the Nature Garden! Angles were being measured and identified in Maths this week with the children learning about acute, right, obtuse, straight and reflex angles. In Science, the children built habitats which they thought woodlice would like to live in. 20 woodlice were found and then left overnight to explore the new habitats and the children recorded the results the next day. A successful Kwik Cricket matched was thoroughly enjoyed by children and dads on Thursday afternoon with some super batting and bowling by both teams.
