

Notification of who is Collecting Your Child

Parents must let school know of any changes in terms of who is collecting their child at the end of the day, as there have been a few occasions when other parents have told the class teacher they are collecting a friend's child.

Due to the new local lockdown restrictions, the adult collecting your child must currently be part of your child's support bubble as socialising with anyone outside their household or support bubble is prohibited.

Government Local Lockdown measures:

Northumberland residents are advised:

Learning Achievements

Reception: This week Reception have been exploring positional language within the classroom and outside and looking at bad and good characters from different stories. We have been making different size beanstalks and seeing who could make the tallest one.

Class 1: This week we have been looking at our daily routines and exploring diary entries. In Maths, Year 1 have been looking at groups and identifying which are greater or smaller than and Year 2 have been working practically to explore tens and ones in two-digit numbers.

Class 2: This week we have been learning about adventure stories and we have been planning our own stories based on Stig of the Dump. In Maths, we have been learning about increasingly large numbers and how we can place these correctly on a numberline. We have been learning about Stonehenge in art and we have created our own Stonehenge shadow pictures.

Class 3: This week we have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000 in Maths. The children have been researching various aspects of everyday life in Ancient Egypt. Using the green screen the children then presented their findings to the rest of the class. In the nature garden the children recreated King Tut's death mask using natural resources and nature's own paint palette of colour.
