#### **Learning Achievements**

**Reception/Class 1**: This week we have been looking at describing mythical creatures and creating our very own. We have started our investigation into which material makes the loudest or quietest sound. In Maths we have been looking at describing position and movement.

Reception have been enjoying exploring mud and making mud/paint pictures.

Class 2: this week the children have been learning more about Charles Darwin and his family. Writing informal letters as one of Darwin's children describing the amazing work their father did at Down House in Kent kept the children busy in English. In Maths they have been interpreting bar charts - learning how to collect and present data required the children to look carefully at the information provided. The children have been learning about puja in R.E and what Hindus place on their puja tray to worship the Gods and Goddesses in their home. The children have also enjoyed Street Science this morning.

# Year 2 and Year 6 SATs week reminder- Monday 13<sup>th</sup>- Friday 17<sup>th</sup> May

- 1. Talk about the SATs and tell them not worry about them. The school will also do this too, but it makes a bigger impact if school and parents do this together. Children perform best when they are relaxed.
- 2. Reading is a key part of primary education so keep encouraging daily reading whether your child reads on their own or if you read together. Discuss the books, the characters, the storylines and encourage your child to express their own opinions on the book. This is important to their long term development as well as SATs test.
- 3. Try to keep everything else running normally. So whether its sport, music lessons or Scouts and Guides; sticking to your normal routine of out of school activities demonstrates to your child that SATs are not the be and end all of year 6.
- 4. During the SATs week, whilst keeping to normal timetable, try to avoid late nights, as children will find sitting the tests tiring.
- 5. Try to make sure your child has some fresh air when they come home from school on test days.
- 6. Stay positive. Many children enjoy taking the tests as they see it as a challenge and like the importance and the feeling of being special that SATs give year 6.

#### **Transition Day**

On Monday, 1<sup>st</sup> July we will have a Transition Day when the children will spend the day in their class come September. Year 6 children will be spending the day in their new High Schools.
