## New School Drivers

Those of you with eagle-eyes would have spotted a change to our school drivers last week, when the curriculum grids were sent out by teachers to inform you what your child is learning this half term.

After a collective meeting with teachers across the Federation, we felt that adding 'Legacy and Making a Difference' to the core drive of our curriculum would be an effective way to teach children about role-models who have changed the world in their own way. Already, Year 5.6 have been learning about Katherine Johnson, the mathematician whose calculations sent the first astronauts into space. We feel that including this focus in our curriculum will not only teach children about these important people but will instil in them the idea that they too can make a difference.


## Class News

## Early Years

Eden class have begun investigating day and night. The children thought of some great questions such as 'Does the moon change shape?' and 'Where do the stars go?' We discussed nighttime routines and carried out an experiment to find out the impact of different liquids on our teeth and the importance of regular tooth brushing. We have enjoyed reading the book Whatever Next! The children hot seated the character Baby Bear and asked how, what, how and why questions. In maths we have learnt about capacity. The children have made milkshake and could represent full, nearly full, half full, nearly empty and empty. A home can your child pour themselves a glass of water and then tell you how much is left after they have drank some?

## Clyde Class

This week Clyde class have been creating an information text about London and we have learnt some interesting facts about Buckingham Palace. In maths we have been exploring 2D and 3D shapes identifying how many edges and vertices the shapes have. To support your child at home, see which shapes they can identity around the house. In Art we have been making our mural artwork by building them up using cardboard. In RE we have been looking at what special objects Jewish people might have within their home.

## Danube Class

In maths this week Year 3 have been learning about the link between multiplication and division. Year 4 have been continuing to multiply 2-digit numbers by 10 and 100. In English we have been continuing to create our own Playscripts based on Roald Dahl's book 'The Witches' which is also our class reader. The children enjoyed working together in groups recreating a world map in Commando Jo's. The maps showed the route the famous journalist Ellie Bly made around the World in 1889. Thank you all for your continued support with the children's reading and times tables at home. Please could you continue to encourage the children to practise their spellings on Edshed to reinforce their learning.

## Mississippi Class

Mississippi class have been writing nonets in English this week - they produced some amazing pieces of work and are looking forward to performing them to the class next week. In maths, year 6 have been working on ratio and year 5 have been using short division. We are enjoying our new science unit 'Earth and Space' and have already had lots of good discussions about our solar system and the planets in it.
