Learning Achievements

Reception/Class 1: this week we have had a few pets visiting our class (dogs, a rabbit and a bearded dragon) and they were all very well behaved! We have been looking at creating story maps for "The Three Little Pigs" and the Creation story. In Maths we have been learning to represent numbers in different ways and in Reception we have been exploring how many ways can we make five.

Class 2: this week we were extremely lucky to meet the children's author Gareth P Jones and spent a most enjoyable afternoon in his company listening to his stories and songs. His enthusiasm for writing was infectious and the children were creating their very own project stories, which was lovely to see. We also had another singing workshop in preparation for the Hexham Abbey festival where the children listened to a live orchestra and choir. In English the children are starting to identify the different features of diary writing. In RE, the children have continued to develop their understanding of the Christian creation story by completing story boards and thinking about how we can be respectful caretakers of the earth. The children have worked really hard on their home learning this week, and there were lots of exciting ancient Greek creations to share with the class. Another very busy week!
