LEARNING ACHIEVEMENTS

RECEPTION

This week reception have continued to explore their topic of Starry Night. We have looked at different people who work at night, and thought about why they need to work at this time. We have retold Peace at Last through making masks and drawing Mr Bear's house and thinking about why it was tricky for him to sleep at night.

In Phonics we have been practising some tricky words and looking at the sound "oo". The children have been really good at finding this sound in different words.

In Maths we've continued to compare different groups of numbers, thinking about more, less and equal to. We've used materials outside to show this, and even had a go at pouring water to make different amounts.

CLASS 1

This week we have been busy looking at instructions in order to make cupcakes and sandwiches for our Royal Tea Party. The children were super excited to come dressed in their smart clothes for our own Royal Tea Party. We have also been learning about the countries that make up the United Kingdom.

In Maths, Year 1 has been looking at a range of strategies to work out addition calculations such as ten frames and number lines. Year 2 has been learning about the multiplication symbol and equal groups.

CLASS 2

Class 2 have been geologists this week! The children have explored a variety of rocks and decided which are Sedimentary, Igneous and Metamorphic. We have also considered how these different types of rocks are used and what their properties are.

In our English sessions, we have explored non-chronological reports; the children took great pleasure in correcting a sample report and everyone was able to point out how this report could be improved.

The year 3 children have been concentrating on their times tables in this week's maths sessions, while the year 4 pupils have learning to multiply by 10 and 100.

In our RE lessons, the children have learned about how Jesus called upon his disciples. Everyone has worked very hard this week.

CLASS 3

This week we have enjoyed Newcastle United, Commando Joe's and our weekly mandarin lesson with Tian.

In English the children have been working on their Allotment non-chronological reports. Both year 5 and year 6 have planned and began to draft these.

In Maths the year 5 children have been multiplying 2 digit by 1 digit and 3 digit by 1 digit numbers using various methods.

The year 6 children have been completing their reflection unit then moving onto understanding and identifying digits with three decimal places.

In Science we have studied life-cycles of animals and humans. The children wrote definitions for our key terms and constructed life-cycle diagrams that they then compared and contrasted, to identify similarities and differences!

Another productive successful week, well done everyone!


