Learning Achievements

Reception/Class 1: This week in Reception we have been creating our own farmyard maps and learning songs about farms. In Maths we have been looking at counting farm animals and working on our adding and take away skills. In class 1 we have been sequencing and acting out the story "The Tiger that came for Tea" and looking at facts about big cats. In Maths we have been recognising different coins and finding the totals.

Class 2: this week the children have been writing instructions as either a soldier in the Greek army or Helen of Troy. The children created instructions on 'how to rescue a queen' or 'how to be rescued' depending on who they chose to be. In Maths, the children have been multiplying, adding, subtracting, finding common multiples and solving multi-step problems.

In topic and English we have been learning more about Greek stories and Greek people. We have looked at different versions of the Trojan Horse story, and researched more about important Greek people who are still famous today for their achievements. We had lots of fun starting to make Top Trump cards for these people, adding our own ratings based on what we learnt about their life.
