

### Numeracy

The children will be covering the following concepts in numeracy this term:

- Place value and decimals
- Addition and subtraction
- Time, shape and data
- Multiplication and division.

### Literacy

Literacy will be based on our topic this term, the children will be covering the following written tasks using our text, Beowulf:

Character profiling, conversations, recounts, invitations, advertisements, letters, explanations, newspaper reports and descriptions.

### French

### Music

## KS2 Spring Term 2016

### Science

As Scientists we will explore a variety of ways to identify, sort, group and classify living things. We will learn how animals are split into 'vertebrates' and 'invertebrates' and begin to consider the differences between living things within these classifications. The children will use and create classification keys to group, identify and name living things from the local habitat and beyond. We will learn that environments are subject to man-made and natural changes, and that these changes can have a significant impact on living things.

### History
