I'm sure you share our eagerness to see all the children shine in these plays. As children are learning their words and songs, we have decided to forgo a homework project this half term, but this will be back after Christmas with a Science themed project. Class News

Early Years

Eden class have read the Mr Man story Mr Rush. The children looked at the characters and identified which 2D shape they were. We made our own Mr Men and could describe them using shape language. The children went on a shape hunt around the school grounds and were brilliant shape spotters! In PE we have started our gymnastics unit it was great to see that we can even make shapes with our bodies when performing different gymnastics holds. At home you could play shape I spy with your child and see if they can identify the object you are describing.

Clyde Class

In Clyde Class we have been creating an information text about space, including captions and diagrams. Linked to our English we have been reading Toys in Space and have been working on a retrieval skill. In Maths we have been continuing to work on addition and subtraction, year 1 have been using part whole models to solve calculations. In year 2 have been using base 10s to help us understand adding and taking away two 2-digit numbers. We have enjoyed our Science experiment linked to bubbles. We made a prediction about which soap mixture would make the most bubbles. To help support your child at home please make sure they continue to practise their lines for our Christmas Nativity.

Danube Class

Danube class have enjoyed revising their multiplication tables and making links to prior learning. They have been identifying different tenses in English and looking at how and why they are used. The children have been scientists and carried out an experiment to test soil around the school site. They have decided to plant tulip bulbs in 3 sites and we will monitor to see if their growth in spring matches our investigation results.

Mississippi Class

Mississippi class have been enjoying their dance lessons in PE and have been learning Bollywood dance moves. In English, they wrote a story based in space and are now beginning to plan a balanced argument around the question 'should humans live on another planet?'. In science, we have been working scientifically and have conducted an experiment to see which substance cleans coins the most and how to make slime - ask your child if they can tell you about the results we found.


