## Learning Achievements

**Reception:** have been developing their listening skills by going on a sound walk around the school grounds. In Maths they have been looking at comparing musical instruments linked to weight and size.

**Class 1:** have been enjoying making a big mess by mixing a range of materials together and writing a recount about session. In Maths they have been learning about finding a half of a shape or quantity.

**Dance Festival:** Reception and KS1 have been busy learning our dance which is The Greatest Show. The children would like to dress up as circus acts. Please could you provide an outfit for the dance. Thank you.

**Class 2:** had a super day in Hexham on Tuesday morning visiting different locations which they were interested in - the children had planned where they wanted to visit before we left school. They wrote notes and took photographs of the locations they had chosen to incorporate into their leaflet which they will create and design at school using Word. In Maths, the children are continuing learning about fractions. Street lighting was discussed in science and the children looked at NCC's new LED street lamps which are being installed in our area this February-April.

How your child can be a Reading Rocketeer...

If your child reads three times a week they will receive a raffle ticket.

This raffle ticket will then be added to the school Reading Jar in Mrs Hutchinson's office. At the end of each half term, 6 tickets will be selected at random. The School Council will consult the children regarding a suitable reward e.g. afternoon tea with the Headteacher, Film Club with popcorn, visiting the local play park etc...

We would really appreciate your co-operation with this. Home/School diaries must be signed and dated by an adult three times per week before your child receives a raffle ticket. Home/School books will be checked by staff on a weekly basis

If your child's ticket is not selected at the end of the half term, the remaining tickets in the School Jar will be looked at and children with a ticket (s) in the jar will receive a 'Reading Rocketeer' certificate to acknowledge that they have been reading at home.
