### A Message from the Head Teacher

It was great to see so many of you at our Harvest Festival last week and it was wonderful to once again get back to our local church. A big thank you to Father Steve & everybody who helped with teas, coffees & a warm church for children to perform. In this newsletter, I can now confirm some of the lovely events we have planned in the next few weeks to enhance what we are able to offer the children; such as our bedtime stories event, Remembrance Day celebration and disco (many thanks to the PTA for organising this). Just after half term, we will be able to give you the details of our Christmas activities coming up including our Christmas fair, Christingle service and performances from the children.

In the past term, we have had visits from our School Improvement Partner and an Ofsted Inspector (who works for the Diocese) to externally validate the amazing work the staff and children do and what a fantastic place Greenhead Primary is. I would like to share some of these with you:

- 1. Behaviour observed around school and in the classrooms was calm and respectful. Pupils in lessons were engaged in their lessons. Relationships between the children and adults were good.
- 2. Behaviour across school is good. The new behaviour policy was consistently implemented, and pupils can articulate the new system.
- 3. The school building is well organised, and space is used effectively. The summer holiday painting program has ensured all classrooms are bright and clean.
- 4. The school is aware of the importance of preparing the pupils for life in modern Britain and one of the four school drivers is Diversity and the Wider World.
- 5. All aspects of Quality of Education, Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development and Leadership have been considered to ensure that the correct priorities for development are identified and actioned.
- 6. There is particular emphasis on outdoor learning in Early Years and the Christian values are instilled through regular class and whole school assemblies.
- 7. The culture of safeguarding is strong. Actions have been taken to ensure the school, the grounds and daily routines support staff in identifying, helping, and managing pupils to feel and stay safe.

#### **Bedtime Stories Event**

On 10th November, all children are welcome to come back into school at 4:30pm for our Bedtime Stories event. Children are welcome to wear their pyjamas, bring their pillows, blankets and a teddy where they can listen to stories read by the adults in the school. Tickets will be £3.00 for the event and will include a hot chocolate and biscuits. Parents will be able to collect children from the front playground at 5:30pm. A letter will go out in the first week of term with more details.

# Class News

#### Eden Class

In Eden we have been exploring signs of Autumn in our brilliant woodland area. We found berries, mushrooms, conkers, acorns, leaves, puddles and mud! The children were great at noticing the change in weather and clothing for this season. From this we have explored leaves, learning the different parts (tip, blade and vein) and the important job leaves do creating food for the tree and creating oxygen. The children collected a range of leaves and painted them autumnal colour to create some amazing leaf prints. We harvested our pumpkin and beetroots and prepared the vegetable patch for planting. In maths we have been finding matching pairs, looking at numbers, size, pattern and the animals on Noah's ark. At home you could encourage your child to help with the laundry by pairing up socks.

# Clyde Class


This week in Clyde Class we have been planning to rewrite our class reader, Giraffes Can't Dance using adjectives and key phrases. In History, we have been looking at timelines and plotting different significant people with the appropriate time phrase. During Maths we have been comparing and ordering objects and numbers in different ways. To support your child at home read a book with them each night and talk about what is happening in the story and discuss their favourite parts.

#### Danube Class

In Danube class have been learning a lot about Lindisfarne this week and the Viking raids that happened there a long time ago. The children have been coming up with questions that they would like to find out on our visit there next week. The children have enjoyed creating their own artwork using computers and have been continuing to learn about digital devices. Please continue to encourage the children to read and complete their Spelling Shed work at home. Have a lovely weekend from all of us in Danube class!

#### Mississippi Class

Mississippi class have been enjoying their Guided Reading text 'Between the Lines' and have been summarising the story for far in a tweet or on a timeline. In maths, year 5 have been learning how to round numbers to estimate an answer and year 6 have been focussing on short division. In English, we have begun focussing on our class poet - Spike Milligan - and we have enjoyed learning his nonsense poem, On the Ning Nang Nong. Ask your child if they can remember the words!
