

Class News

Early Years

In Eden class we have been exploring number bonds to 5 and to 10. The children can subitise to five and can combine two groups to find the total. In RE we have been learning about the Easter story. The children made their own palm leaves and crosses, they were so proud of their creations. For snack we shared hot cross buns together and discussed how the symbol of the cross reminds Christians that Jesus died on the cross. Why not ask your child if they can re-tell the Easter story.

Clyde Class

Clyde class have enjoyed taking part in different science experiments linked to materials. We investigated which material would be best to use for our cutlery and why. During English we have been creating story maps about one of our favourite class reader books, The Smartest Giant in Town. We have used our maps to rewrite the story in our own words. In Maths Year 1 have been exploring numbers within 50 using resources to represent them. In Year 2 we have been looking at identifying a half of a shape or quantity. At home continue to support your child with their reading over the Easter Break and practising counting from any given number in 1s, 2s, 5s or 10s.

Danube Class

We have really enjoyed practising for the dance festival over the past few weeks. The children have worked really hard to work together to create a poi inspired dance. In Maths the children have enjoyed starting to learn about length and capacity. In art they have created some very detailed, well designed mosaic. They also showed patience and resilience when constructing their fantastic designs. We hope you all have a wonderful Easter break. Thank you for your continued support with the children's, reading, spellings and times tables at home.

Mississippi Class

Mississippi class are very much looking forward to the Easter break! We have worked super hard this term to become more secure in fractions and decimals in maths and to write our own persuasive leaflets in English. In Science, we investigated which materials dissolve and what this means and in Geography we learned all about time zones and how they are different in different parts of the world. We have enjoyed our dance P.E sessions with Mr Hill and have also enjoyed reading our Guided Reading text 'Omar's Farm'.
