Learning Achievements

Reception: have been looking at which material would be best for a bed for a pea! They have looked at naming and describing a range of 2D and 3D shapes and created pictures using shapes. They enjoyed baking for their grandparents' afternoon tea.

Class 1: have been writing complaint letters to the troll from 'The Three Billy Goats'. They have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and dividing by 2, 5 and 10. They continue to enjoy their weekly swimming lessons.

Class 2: have been measuring widths of books, finding the capacity of 3D shapes and drawing treasure map with approximate areas. In Science the children have been researching the biodiversity of either the Arctic or Antarctica Ocean. Baking skills and team work were used when the children made scones and shortbread biscuits for our grandparents. Haiku poetry with a polar theme was created and performed by the children following the traditional structure of 5-7-5 syllables in each line. They had an interesting and informative visit from the Institute of Mining and Engineers.

Governor news

As parents/families may be aware there are consultations currently taking place throughout the West of Northumberland with regard to the future provision of education for the area. One of the primary focuses of this consultation is the full implementation of a two tier system. As a federation we sit comfortably within this model. Staff have been advised to remain impartial in the process; however, we would urge our Year 4 families to consider carefully their decision regarding Year 5 provision onwards.

Because we are Primary Schools you can be assured of continuity of learning here until the end of Year 6, whereas if your child transfers to a Middle School the possibility is that things may change again before they reach high school age.

The first stage of this consultation was for school staff and Governors to express their views. This consultation process will continue until July and parents can contribute their opinions at a later date.

We will keep you all informed of the process as time goes on but can we please assure you that whatever the outcome may be, we will continue to work with other provisions to ensure a smooth transition for each child onto the next stage of their education.
