#### RECEPTION

This week we have started the new topic 'Once upon a time'. This is a lovely way of developing the children's love of reading, re-telling and acting out familiar and traditional stories.

Mrs Knowles, with the help of the children, have transformed the home corner into a fantastic castle.

The children have enjoyed dressing up as wizards, princesses and story characters.

In maths, the children have been gaining a deeper understanding of numbers to 4 by counting and subitising sets up to 4 objects in various forms.

We have also made some fantastic firework pictures to coincide with our lesson on 'Why we have Bonfire night?'

#### CLASS 1

The children in class one have made a great start to our new half term!

In English, both the year one and two children have been working on their punctuation skills this week, editing given sentences and their own writing to ensure the necessary capital letters and full stops are included!

In Maths, the year one children have been working on addition and subtraction, breaking numbers apart, creating fact families and counting back.

The year two children have also been working on addition and subtraction, crossing ten, adding two-digit and one-digit numbers using exchanging and column methods.

In Science we have answered our Autumn two pop tasks questions and also a big question- 'Is a tree alive?' There were some great scientific answers!

#### CLASS 2

The children in class 2 have become poets this week!

We have explored the syllable and word class patterns of cinquains and we have linked these to our learning on the Iron Age too.

Everyone has shown an impressive understanding of addition and subtraction this week as we have learned to use different formal methods. We have also continued to work on learning our times tables and it has been a delight to see everyone putting effort into this at home!

Our RE sessions have focused on the Gospels and we have explored how Luke, Matthew and John tell story of Christ's birth.

#### **CLASS 3**

In class 3 this week we have been learning Mandarin! We had our first lesson via zoom with Tian and learnt to count to ten and to say hello. The children did really well despite a few technical difficulties.

The children created their own mangonel in science as they were introduced to levers as part of their new topic. The mangonels fired ping pong balls across the hall and some travelled quite a distance

In maths the children have been learning about the order of operations and interpreting two-way tables to answer questions.

Writing their biography about Cheng Tang has been our English focus this week, with the children editing and improving their first draft.

NUFC is still on a Monday and swimming on a Tuesday but there is no Commando Joes on a Wednesday this half term, so normal school uniform on a Wednesday please.

We need 2 litre clear plastic bottles to transform into poppies for Remembrance Day on Thursday. If you have any at home please send them to school.

Where: School hall/Class 2 classroom


