

Dear Friends,

April is possibly the most important month of this year – for the Church that is.

Firstly we have the performance of "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat" to look forward to on April 8th at 7.00pm. The choir largely made up of members of Holy Cross and St.Cuthbert's congregations, together with the help of some local instrumentalists and singers will perform the Tim Rice and Andrew Lloyd Webber classic re-telling of the story of Joseph. Tickets are available at £5, with the profits being shared between Chin Up and Holy Cross. Do come along and join us for a fun night out!

Then on the 16th we celebrate Easter, the great feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord. To help prepare for that we begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday on April 9th, there will be a celebration of the Eucharist on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday in Holy Week at 10.00am in Holy Cross before we enter the solemn days of the Triduum: Maundy Thursday (13th) will be marked by an Agape, at 7.30pm in Holy Cross, based on the Passover Meal, with a celebration of the Eucharist (please let myself or a Churchwarden known if you intend to come, for catering purposes, it's a three course meal so donations are welcome.)

Good Friday (14th) will have the usual Procession of Witness organised by Churches Together in Haltwhistle, from St.Wilfrid's (at 10.00am) to Holy Cross, stopping en-route at the Methodist Chapel. We keep the Solemn Liturgy of the Day at Greenhead at Noon. The Easter fire will be lit at 6.00am on Easter Day at Holy Cross (no 8.00am that morning) followed by our usual 9.30am Eucharist in Haltwhistle and 11.00am at St.Cuthberts.

Wardens report

Holy Cross wardens continue to ensure that the fabric of the church is kept in good order. During the year we have overseen any maintenance and repairs that have been necessary to keep our building warm, watertight and safe. This has included – heating serviced, guttering & roof repairs. Following the retirement of Michael Drage we are in the process of selecting and appointing a new architect with relevant experience of Churches of the caliber of Holy Cross. We continue to address the minor maintenance items which were highlighted in the quinquennial report as time and finances allow.

Magazine editor's report

The magazine continues to be well read and received by members of our communities and beyond. We print 500 copies a month and distribute either by hand or through a number of the shops in the town. We also send out around 50 by email to as far away as Barcelona. We continue to be grateful to our 27+ advertisers who see the benefit of our magazine as a way to promote their businesses and services to our readers – their financial contributions to our printing costs means we can continue to provide the magazine free to our readers. We are always happy to receive submissions of articles, information and events to include and will always do our best to print them.

PCC Secretary's report

The PCC has met 10 times during 2016. At each meeting we receive and discuss reports on:- finance, building fabric, social committee, events, tourism, deanery & diocesan synod. The PCC continues to oversee the life of our Church alongside where it fits within our other community churches (via Churches Together in Haltwhistle) and the wider Anglican Church (Hexham Deanery and Newcastle Diocese). We are pleased that the Church continues to be used as a venue for community events (concerts, exhibitions, meals, etc) as well as the wide range of religious events (Eucharist, Baptism, Wedding, Funerals, Christingle, Easter, Remembrance, etc.). This reminds us that our Church continues to be at the heart of our community. We have a number of vacancies on the PCC and would welcome members of the congregation to come and join us.

The Ecumenical Advent Service was held in St Wilfrid's Church followed by refreshments – a very pleasant event.



PCC Treasurer's Report 2016

I would like to start my report by thanking you all, be that members of the congregation, citizens of Haltwhistle or the team of people who work hard to keep Holy Cross running.

2016 has been a reasonable year. The year-end should see us with a small deficit of some 5% of our income before we claim back Gift Aid from the government. This means we have comfortably paid our way in 2016.

Though the PCC has money invested, it is not available for use by the PCC to pay for the everyday costs of running the Church. The money invested is restricted; it can only be used for work on the building itself. It has been given to Holy Cross for specific purposes and I cannot use it for the day-to-day running of the building e.g. to pay the gas and electricity bills.

The PCC, however, has continued to invest money in the building over the years in its endeavors to reduce costs and to increase the use of the Church.

The PCC introduced the 'Highlights Rural Touring Scheme', which is enjoyed by more and more people, and thus increases our income while bringing something new and exciting to the community.

The PCC has opened up the building so it can be used for coffee mornings, concerts, presentations and readings. The purchase last year of a portable stage has increased the versatility of the building. If you would like to use the Church please do get in touch, the acoustics are great!

I am not in a position to give you definitive figures yet (I can't until the External Examiner and the PCC have approved them) but we can consider some percentages.

You will all be sick of me mentioning Gift Aid, but it is important to our income. If you pay tax and Gift Aid your donations, we receive back from the Chancellor 25% extra at no cost to you.

We have seen a small reduction of 5% this year in all giving to Holy Cross.

Our fund raising efforts in 2016 have seen a small increase in income. Thanks must go to the hard work and commitment of the volunteers who give of their time and effort to help raise funds. This would seem an appropriate time to thank all those people who support the Church through their efforts at Coffee Mornings and other fund raising occasions.

On a positive note, we have again managed to reduce our administration costs, but as our admin. costs are not a large part of our budget it is helpful though not significant.

All in all it has been a fairly good year for us, but we are continually trying to reduce our costs and increase the use of the Church.

With a Grade 1 listed building such as Holy Cross, building maintenance is ongoing and, because of the age and nature of the building, expensive. Luckily expenses have been low this year.

We have managed to reduce our spending on running the Church in 2016, but that may be more to do with mild weather than anything we have done.

For Holy Cross, regular giving is absorbed in everyday activities such as paying the parish share, insurance and heating the building, repairing the roof etc.




