RECEPTION

This week the children have been having fun with the book Dear Dinosaur. They even had a surprise visit from a dinosaur who left behind glittery footprints! The children have also been palaeontologists for their science day. They hunted for bones in the nature garden and put a skeleton together that they found. They have been asking lots of questions about how fossils are formed and had a go at making their own out of salt dough. They used their maths skills to compare different sizes, measure lengths of dinosaur bones and weigh out ingredients. In phonics, everyone has worked hard on writing more tricky words. The children have been trying hard to recognise some common words that we can't sound out. All their 'Action Words' practice has really helped. Well done to all our 'Doctors' for being such good scientists and mathematicians this week.

CLASS 1

This week we had lots of fun during our Science day where we learnt about different habitats and exploring different animals and plants you can find within them. We also created our own habitats within a shoebox.

In Maths, year 1 have been measuring the length and height of different objects using rulers and year 2 have been solving reasoning problems linked to pictograms and block diagrams.

In English we have been creating expanded noun phrases for Famous London landmarks and creating questions about them.

CLASS 2

This week the children have celebrated British Science day!

Everyone followed the scientific method to find out which chemicals made the strongest volcanic eruption; it looked fantastic when we created 3D volcanoes for an eruption demonstration. We used our design skills to create a sturdy volcano model before painting them to make sure they looked realistic. We all had such fun doing this!

The children have also enjoyed converting different units of measure and solving problems. In our RE session this week, we explored why Good Friday is 'good' and it was excellent to hear everyone linking this event to the rest of Holy Week.

CLASS 3

In English we have been publishing our Fair-Trade persuasive leaflets. We distributed these during our Fair-Trade informative event that we held this afternoon! Well done everyone, you were very professional and knowledgeable! Next week we are moving onto balanced arguments! In Maths the Year 6 children have been studying volume, using their knowledge and understanding of this to build various 3D shapes and to solve given problems.

The year 5 children have been studying decimal numbers, identifying whole numbers, tenths, hundredths and thousandths then rounding to the nearest tenth and whole numbers!

In Science we have been looking at the Human Adolescent stage. We firstly answered a Big Question-'What changes to the human body does puberty involve?

To celebrate British Science week, we held our Class 3 Forensics Science Day on Thursday, where the children stumbled across a crime scene! They worked hard to think scientifically and utilise their scientific skills, sealing off the scene to preserve the evidence and not contaminate it. The children used equipment responsibly and accurately, such as lifting and taking fingerprints, swabbing for DNA, using chromatography paper to separate mixtures of soluble substances, collecting fibres, measuring and

analysing hand and footprints and any other clues they could identify. The children identified possible suspects (on the staff photo board!) and worked collaboratively and effectively to establish if any of the evidence incriminated any of these suspects. The children composed questions to interrogate and held suspect interviews with the final two prime suspects.

Ask your child.... 'Who was guilty'?!

Thank you everyone- your enthusiasm, participation and contributions were amazing! In art we looked at drawing with shading techniques.

The children selected their own subject in which to practise these techniques.

A great week everyone- well done!


The PTA are planning an Easter raffle fundraiser and are asking for Easter themed donations.
