Learning Achievements

Reception: In Reception we have been grouping objects and explaining how we have grouped them. We have looked at following instructions whilst pretending to be sheepdogs.

Class 1: This week we have been creating leaflets and fact sheets about big cats and learning about what jobs a zookeeper needs to do. In Maths we have been learning about adding and subtracting ones and using part whole models. We have also enjoyed our Harvest Festival service in church.

Class 2: this week the children have been editing a letter from the King of Athens and then creating their own letter as either a child from Athens or the Minotaur. In Maths, the older children have been using factors to help them divide while the younger children have continued to add and subtract 3-digit and 4-digit numbers. In Topic, the children reflected on their trip to The Great North Museum last week, thinking about what they have learnt and what they enjoyed about their visit. They have also been finishing their top trump cards of famous Ancient Greek people, some of whom are still famous today.
