Learning Achievements

Reception: This week we have been exploring the nature garden, exploring the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears and talking about our favourite characters. In Maths, we have been singing The Little Speckled Frogs and finding different ways to represent numbers. We have also had our first PE lesson exploring different ways of moving.

Class 1: We have continued to work on Goldilocks and the Three Bears, creating our own story maps and adding key phrases. We have also been in the nature garden making a house for the bears. In Maths, we have been using resources to represent numbers. This week we have also had our first PE lesson with NUFC

Class 2: This week we have been writing our own Stone Age fact files using subheadings and paragraphs to organise our work. In Maths, we have extended our place value knowledge into hundreds and thousands. We have also enjoyed learning about the Bible in R.E and we have explored the story of Noah from the Old Testament. We have all been working very hard in class 2 this week!

Class 3: This week the children have been learning all about the Egyptian hierarchical system. They have researched one particular social group and created a fact file full of their findings which they then presented to the rest of the class. In Maths, we have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000 and creating 7 digit numbers. Careful observational skills were used as the children carefully sketched treasures found inside King Tut's tomb.

School Transport

COVID-19- Guidance published on 8.9.2020

What to do if a pupil is displaying symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19)

If anyone in school becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they must be sent home and be advised to follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.

This sets out that they must:

- self-isolate for at least 10 days
- arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)

We appreciate that children can catch a cold and can be unwell at this time of the year but if you think your child has any of the symptoms then please follow the NHS guidance and arrange for them to have a test and inform the school office immediately.

A negative result means the test did not find coronavirus.

You do not need to self-isolate if your test is negative, as long as:

- everyone you live with who has symptoms tests negative
- everyone in your support bubble who has symptoms tests negative
- you were not told to self-isolate for 14 days by NHS Test and Trace
- you feel well – if you feel unwell, stay at home until you're feeling better

If you have diarrhoea or you're being sick, stay at home until 48 hours after they've stopped.

To comply with our risk assessment and for the safety of everyone in the building we will encourage children to wash their hands regularly and practice social distancing where possible. Cleaning hours have been extended and staff are diligent in using limited resources and cleaning items regularly throughout the day. Any concerns, please let us know.
