# LEARNING ACHIEVEMENTS

### RECEPTION

We've had another super week in reception.

In Maths, we've been looking at hidden amounts. We've been using 5 hedgehogs and working out how many are hiding when we can only see some of them. The children have also been looking at mass and comparing heavier and lighter objects. They used these skills as a class to make and compare playdough. In literacy, we've continued with our phonics, revising the sounds th ch sh and ng. We've innovated on our Peace at Last story, creating a class story about Olive Owl who is trying to sleep in school during the day..... but it's too noisy!

We've looked at our bedtime routine, and focused on the importance of brushing our teeth. We did an experiment putting boiled eggs in different drinks to see what happened to the shell. We found that the shell changed colour and parts peeled off when there was a lot of sugar.

Our Pyjama Party was a lot of fun. The children explored the moon and stars, had a go at being different night time workers and went camping to look for nocturnal animals outside.

### CLASS 1

This week we have been learning new facts about the Queen to create our own information text. We have started to explore deciduous and evergreen trees and looked in the local area for some examples of each of the trees.

In RE we have been learning about what happens during the Jewish festival of Sukkot.

### CLASS 2

This week the children have been working hard on their non-chronological reports. Miss Callaghan is immensely proud of how hard everyone has been working and she cannot wait to read them and learn all about the layers of the earth. The children have also learned about fossils and how they are formed. As part of our work on fossils, the children looked at a variety of sources and learned about the work of Mary Anning.

Our Maths lessons have focused on times tables and using these facts to calculate with larger numbers. It is fantastic to see everyone continuing to learn their times tables at home too!

In our science lesson this week, the children explored forces and found the points of contact between two objects.

# CLASS 3

This week we had a fantastic time visiting the Hexham Quatre Bras Allotments. The children looked around the different patches, discussed the various plants and trees that were and had been growing. We were lucky enough to hold a chicken and listen to information from allotment owners including Miss Mitchell! Thank you to Miss Mitchell for accommodating us and sharing your knowledge and expertise with the children.

In English the children have been drafting and editing their Non-Chronological Allotment reports, some are beginning to word process in order to produce a professional report, adding images from our visit. In Maths, year 5 have been working on Multiplication and division using a range of methods! Year 6 children have been multiplying and dividing decimal numbers by 10,100 and 1000! Well done, your problem solving skills involving this were impressive!

In Science we have been studying mammals and the five key mammalian characteristics. The children completed labelled diagrams and written work including key topic vocabulary! They even created their own mammal creatures!



# Ending self-isolation early using LFD tests (Updated from 17th January 2022 onwards)

It is now possible to end self-isolation after 5 full days if you have 2 negative LFD tests taken on consecutive days. The first LFD test should not be taken before the fifth day after your symptoms started (or the day your test was taken if you did not have symptoms). The self-isolation period remains 10 full days for those without negative results from 2 LFD tests taken a day apart.
