Eden

In Eden the children have enjoyed reading the traditional tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. We have extended our vocabulary through drawing club, the children now know the meaning and created actions for construct, exhale, flimsy, sturdy and obliterate. We looked at different materials such as wood, plastic and metal and found items made of these in our classroom. We carried out a science experiment to see which items the big bad Wolf could huff and puff. The children made great predictions based on the materials properties, we learnt about fair testing and had fun finding out the results. In maths we have begun to explore numbers 4 and 5. We have looked at different picture representations of each number and made our own using multi-link cubes. We have sung lots of number rhymes and represented them using five frames or finger numbers.

At home ask your child to show you the actions for each of our wonderful new words; construct, exhale, flimsy, sturdy and obliterate

Clyde

In Clyde class we have been enjoying our science investigations where we made predictions about what would happen to marshmallows if we heated them up and used our observations skills to see which products can melt. To continue to support your child's learning at home in melting explore which foods can melt at home.

In Maths we have been comparing two-digit numbers and sequencing them in order.

We have also had workshops linked to emotions and about being good friends. During English we have continued to learn our new phonics sounds split diagraphs whilst year 2 have been writing a diary entry about a night in the Toy Museum. We have also created some artwork linked to Remembrance Day where the children took part in the two minute silence at the cenotaph on Remembrance Day.

Danube

In English, we are learning about the features of a narrative and using our new guided reading book 'Blast to the Past' to write our own story that includes setting and character descriptions as well as speech between characters. We have also started our new class reader, The Witches, which we are enjoying. In maths, we have begun multiplication and division. In science, we have started our new topic 'Working Scientifically' and have completed our first investigation examining suitable soils to grow tulip bulbs. In History, we have been exploring the impact of iron and how iron changed the way people lived during the Iron Age. Please continue to support your children through daily reading, Spelling Shed and Sumdog. If you have any problems, please email in. Test the children on different times tables!

Mississippi

The second half of autumn term is in full swing - and so is the excitement about the school production! The children have been writing some excellent science fiction stories in English, drawing on the work of HG Wells amongst others! We are nearing the end of The Girl of Ink and Stars in guided reading. It feels like every session ends on a cliffhanger at the moment- it truly is a spell-binding book. The next book- which we are due to start very soon- is a good one, too and continues the science fiction genre. In science, we are honing our skills in working scientifically with a series of investigations which will help practise different ways of presenting results- in graphs, charts or comparisons.

Mississippi class were also lucky enough to have the opportunity this week to work with Miss Teasdale, who will be teaching them after Christmas. I know she is really looking forward to being here at Greenhead and
