Class News

Early Years

We have been exploring emotions in Literacy and PSED through stories such Ruby's Worry, The Colour Monster and In My Heart. The children have identified a range of emotions such as proud, calm, love and happy. They have given wonderful examples of times they have felt each emotion. In maths the children have been comparing size and have used great vocabulary such as tall, enormous and tiny. We created a class height chart and made a picnic for the three bears.

In RE we have learnt all about Harvest festival and created a wonderful scarecrow and a delicious apple crumble. At home why not create your very own family height chart.

Clyde Class

In Clyde class we have been creating a set of instructions to make jam sandwiches using a range of imperative verbs. In Maths we have been using a variety of resources to compare numbers within 20 and using language such as greater than and less than.

We have enjoyed our History lesson where we have been learning about George Stephenson and why he is significant to our local area. In Science we have been finding out which fabric would be the best suited for a pair of curtains and why. To support your child's learning at home see if they can count some objects into two groups and see if they can identify which group has more or less.

Danube Class

Danube class had a wonderful day at Beamish last week. The children had the opportunity to explore the different parts of the museum and take part in a pottery workshop. In English we have been starting to plan a piece of historical narrative. We were inspired to base our story on the Viking raid of Lindisfarne with children choosing to write from a monk's or Viking's perspective. The children will be encouraged to use descriptive language to retell what happened on that fateful day. This has been a fantastic opportunity as it is linked with our history topic which also gets the children ready for their trip to Lindisfarne next half term. In science we have been exploring our outside areas looking at plants and the effect of sunlight in sunny and shaded areas. In maths we have been consolidating our place value knowledge practising comparing, ordering and identifying numbers. To support your child's learning, we appreciate your continued support with reading, spellings and times tables at home. We are currently focusing on times tables in class, Year 3 focusing on the 3- and 4-times tables and Year 4 on the 4 and 6.-times tables.

Mississippi Class

Mississippi had a fabulous day at the Beamish Museum. We made the most of the day and some of the things we saw were a 1900s classroom and met some teachers dressed from that period. We played some games that children played during that time. We explored different parts of the town including a dentist surgery and cinema. We took a ride and an old locomotive, a tram and made some pottery!

Mississippi have been working hard on biographies of Sir Isaac Newton, exploring his important work and linked to our topic in Science all about forces. In maths, we finished our place value topic and have been working hard on adding and subtracting whole numbers where there are more than four digits. Ask your children about friction and how that impacts our daily lives!
